

## The Mt Cass Walkway

- The walkway traverses a working farm, with sheep and cattle in the paddocks.
- There is no access off the track.
- Dogs and firearms are prohibited.
- Cycles and motorcycles are prohibited.
- Camping is not permitted.
- Beware of farm vehicles that use the tracks.
- The water in the tanks and troughs is not suitable for human consumption.
- Please do not interfere with any marker posts or monitoring markers.
- Do not use any of the gates. Stiles are provided for all fence crossings.
- Take care when walking on rocks; they can be slippery when wet.
- Special care is required during foggy or windy conditions.
- Beware of the electric fences. They should be treated as live at all times.

**There is a toilet at Loop Track Junction.**

**Cooperative development** Mt Cass Walkway was developed cooperatively by the Waipara Valley Promotion Association and Transwaste Canterbury Limited, with local people providing many hours of volunteer labour and donated materials. It was first opened to the public on 10 April 2006.

## New Zealand Environmental Care Code

### Your 10 point checklist

- **Protect plants and animals:** Treat New Zealand's forest and birds with care and respect. They are unique and often rare.
- **Remove rubbish:** Litter is unattractive, harmful to wildlife and can increase vermin and disease. Plan your visits to reduce rubbish, and carry out what you carry in.
- **Stay on established tracks and use existing facilities:** By using existing facilities, where these are provide, you run less chance of disturbing wildlife and damaging riverbanks and foreshores.
- **Keep to the track:** By keeping to the track, where one exists, you lessen the chance of damaging fragile plants.
- **Consider plants and animals:** Remember we are only visitors to water environments. Other animal and plant species live there all the time.
- **Respect our cultural heritage:** Many places in New Zealand have a spiritual and historical significance. Treat these places with consideration and respect.
- **Enjoy your visit:** Enjoy your outdoor experience. Take a last look before leaving an area; will the next visitor know that you have been there?
- **Consider others:** People visit the back country and rural areas for many reasons. Be considerate of other visitors who also have a right to enjoy the natural environment.
- **Find out first:** Find out and follow the regulations governing recreational use of waterways and access.
- **Protect the environment:** For your own sake, for the sake of others including those who come after you, and for the environment itself.

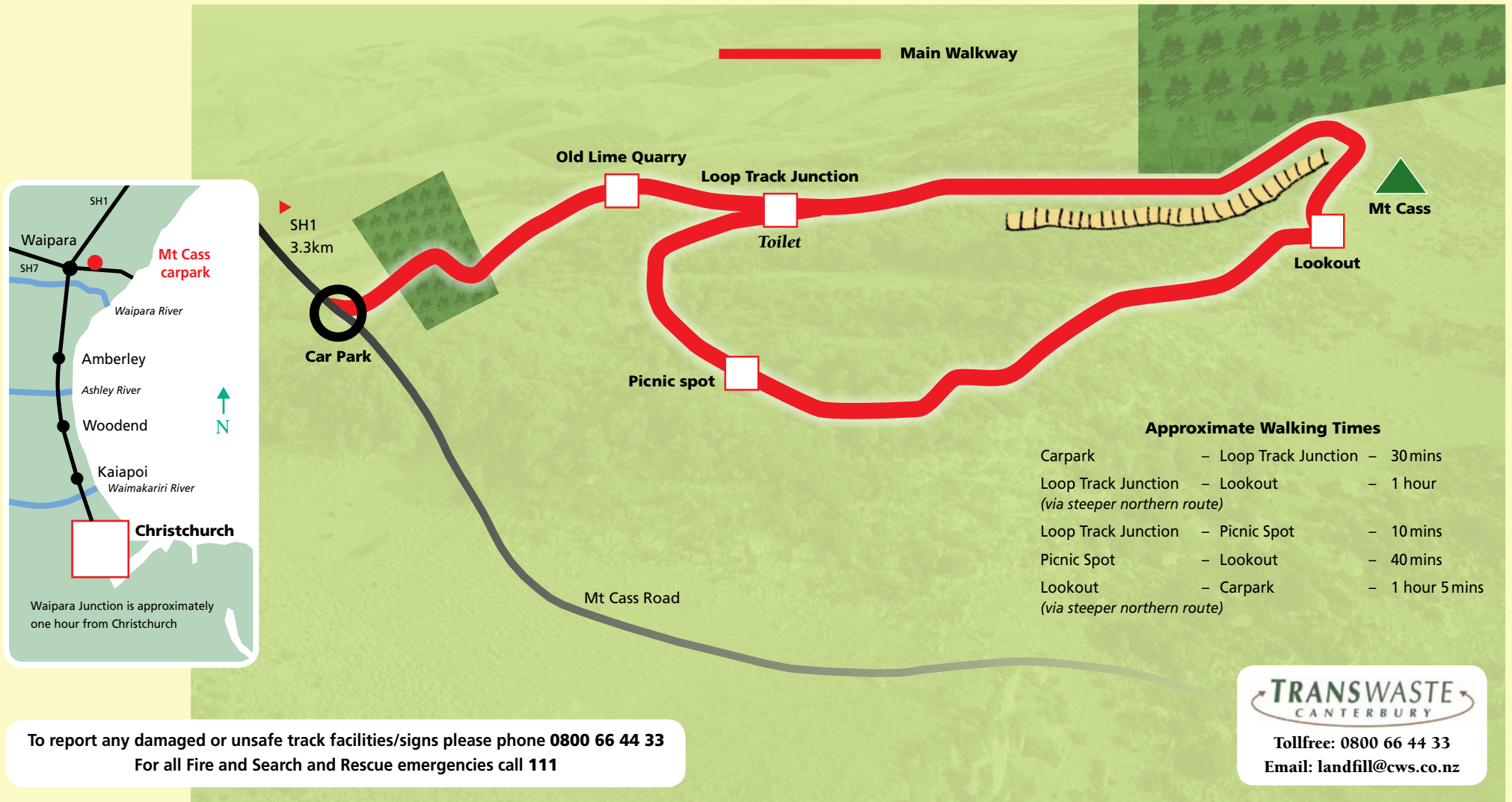
